A message from Huw

A Lenten Paradox

In the next few weeks there is a curious clash of dates. February 14th is, of course, Valentine's Day when sales of pink cards, red roses, and all colours of chocolate will sky rocket. This year it is also Ash Wednesday, which has much more sombre associations. Self-indulgence and self-discipline both on the same day? Maybe I'm cynical, but I can guess which one will get most publicity, and have most followers.

And yet there's a curious suitability in this overlap. Why does anyone ever give anything up? The slimmer gives up certain foods, or drink, because they want to feel better about their bodies. The athlete sticks to a rigid diet and training schedule in the hope of winning an event. But a parent may deprive themselves of all sorts of things they enjoy in order to save money to spend on their children. A lover may forgo a luxury in order to treat their beloved.

It is a little like that with Christians and Lent. No, we're not exactly giving God a treat, but our motive for imposing some small discipline on ourselves is Love. We want to grow in our love for God, and freely giving something up is one way that helps many of us. In fact, the classic pattern is to give something up, and take something on, and these two can easily overlap. If we give up sweets, crisps, alcohol, or anything else we might want to give the money we've saved to a charity. All through the Bible we get the message that our love for God is meant to be more than a warm inner feeling that makes us feel good. True love for God is shown in the way we treat others, especially those most in need.

There is a curious addition to all of this. Maybe I'm weaker willed than the rest of you, but I rarely get all the way through Lent without wobbling, and slipping back into whatever it is I'd given up.

Two things follow from this. The first is my having to resist the temptation to say, "That's it – I might as well give the whole thing up now". We all know how fatal that is with any training or diet. The second is that I get drawn back to the love of God for me – that love that is greater than any failing or weakness on my part. Just as our little Lenten sacrifices help train us for greater sacrifices that may lie ahead, so our awareness of God's forgiveness for our little lapses helps us to believe that God does still love us when we make a mess of something really important. And it is that love which keep us safe, in this world and the next.

A note from the Editors

We like the idea of taking something on new in Lent, as a balance to something given up. You may even consider doing in Lent something new but useful – without giving anything up!

There are so many things that we can do, to improve ourselves, or to help others, including actively helping the work of our Benefice, if you are not doing so already. Who knows – you may find it so satisfying that you will want to continue doing it, long after Lent has been transformed by Easter! Most people have talents that lie dormant and could be woken up to benefit others.

If nothing obvious comes to mind, consider discussing with people who are active volunteers in the Benefice (e.g. those on the 'Who's Who in the Parish' page – you can find this on the Friends of St Mary's Winkfield website. Go to www.fosmw.com and press the blue [Parish Mag] button at the top).

Giving money to good causes is important, as only in this way can you achieve good that you cannot bring about yourself – but personal voluntary action for a good cause is just as good as the equivalent money – perhaps even better.

Ascot Horticultural Society

February may be the last month of the "meteorological winter" but the cold wet weather does not necessarily show much sign of relenting. Nevertheless, in order to be able to 'hit the ground running' when the growing season eventually gets underway it's a good time for planning and preparation. Seeds can be ordered, seed potatoes purchased and laid out to 'chit', new plants identified to try, tools cleaned and sharpened The list goes on.

The new programme for the Horticultural Society is, to some extent, complementary. For example :-

on Wednesday 14th March the focus will be squarely on seeds, the guest speaker being:

Paulo Arrigo of Seeds of Italy Ltd. – UK distributors for Franchi Seeds. With a lively talk entitled "Italy from Seed to Plate" he will be considering the history and development of vegetables from Roman times through to the present day. We can expect the meeting to take on a distinctly Mediterranean 'flavour'.

Paul Patton, a professional horticulturalist, writer and broadcaster will be making a welcome return to the society on Wednesday 9 May. This time he will be offering advice and tips on how to grow and enjoy all types of "Wonderful Healthy Herbs" in the garden, containers and kitchen - herbs for teas and other drinks, herbs to attract bees, butterflies and other pollinators, herbs in history and much more.

This month it will be our turn to host the Annual Quiz – our yearly 'battle of wits' with Sunningdale and District Gardening Association. Last year Ascot won by a small margin. Will Sunningdale dominate this time or can we retain the title for another year and with it the prestigious and uniquely shaped Alistair Fosdyke Trophy? We will find out on Wednesday 14th February.

Another traditional event for the Society is the Spring Show in King Edward's Hall on the evening of Wednesday 11 April, which is invariably a highly colourful occasion.


