A message from Huw

When Things Go Wrong

Recently I caught the end of a radio programme where people were discussing the ways in which technology can let you down. The final comment stuck in my mind; a woman had rung in to say that her dish washer kept refusing to work. "He's 5' 8", bearded, and my husband!"

The subject caught my interest, as I seem to have been caught out by things going wrong quite a bit recently, particularly my car. As I'm not the most practical chap in the world this can leave me feeling not only helpless but useless as well. If only I was better at doing things I wouldn't have got into this mess in the first place, and I'd certainly know how to get out of it!

However, on reflection, two things strike me. First of all is how kind people are. When I've been stuck all sorts of people have turned out and worked hard on my behalf, giving me their time and energy. This, to me, says something very important about human nature which it can be easy to lose sight of – we are all made in the image of God, and are designed to express his love and care to others. The media is always full of terrible stories of things going wrong, and people acting in terrible ways, but we need to remember that this is the exception. There is a basic goodness at the heart of humanity, which deserves to be celebrated whenever we see it.

Secondly, it strikes me how much I take for granted. All around me are labour saving gadgets that my grandparents could never have imagined. My nana did the weekly wash by hand, and then put clothes through a mangle to crush the water out. Having a washing machine, in her own kitchen, would have been unimaginable luxury for her.

Am I grateful for all these appliances, and the easy life I lead as a result? On the whole, no. Oh maybe at first, when something is new, I'll be amazed by it, but very quickly it fades into the background and I forget about it. It's only when things go wrong that I realise how lucky I am most of the time. As Christians we believe that all good gifts ultimately come from God, even when human ingenuity has been involved as well. It's no bad thing to take a moment to stop and give thanks for all the blessings we enjoy – even when things are going well.

A note from the Editors


My father, Harry Hodson, in his day a distinguished journalist and economist, could never see the point of computers, while accepting that two of his sons (I was one) were heavily employed in developing and using that technology.

Computers used to be room-sized monsters, used only by nerdish techies – now with miniaturisation they form a component, often lurking but unseen, in almost every aspect of our lives, whether we like it or not, and often while we are unaware of it. Like the invention of pen and paper (my father's tools), the technology of the miniature computer is shaping the way we live, the way we think and act, and even the way in which we relate to each other. Now with Al (Artificial Intelligence) we humans are devising computer systems that are (intellectually, if that's the right word) more and more 'in our own image'.

A little automaton that bumbles about carefully vacuum-cleaning the house (£149 from www.myrobotcenter.co.uk) takes on a routine human physical job. What has already come, and will continue to come is a taking over of most routine thinking jobs, too.

Never before have we been more in need of God's help in understanding how we humans, in our homes, offices, social life and communities, and even countries, should maintain moral and charitable standards in relation to our fellow human beings, in the face of technology.

Not all countries – not even many people in our own country – have the benefit of technological efficiency, and this affects their economic wellbeing. Hatred, the use of violence by word and weaponry, and even war is too often the result. How will countries like ours work to counter the effects of inequality-caused discord and create or maintain peace, without God's wisdom and help?

This was originally the main entrance to Mercers' Hall, the Hall of the City London's premier Livery Company. It was acquired by Swanage from the Mercers' Company in 1880, through the Company's association with the Mowlem family, who founded the big construction company in 1822. The Mowlem company was absorbed Carillion in 2006.

During our two previous events over 750 men have undergone tests and, according to the retired Consultant Urologist who analyses results and provides advice, more than 30 have been warned about previously undiagnosed prostate problems.

Thoughts of all sorts

The Woodley Festival

The Editors have now been supporting the Woodley Festival of Music and Drama for no less than 42 years, even since our daughter Lucy took part in her first piano class. The event is still an important part of the March-time calendar for us as for many young musicians – and a few older ones too. At the festival they have the opportunity to perform in front of others and gain lots of confidence. They hear fellow musicians do their stuff – and they realise that each of them faces the same problems and challenges. And they benefit from the helpful advice given by expert adjudicators. Nearly all young musicians – and prose/poetry speakers too – would benefit from taking part in the Festival.

The great Hungarian composer Zoltan Kodaly found that schools in his country had very poor music tuition. In 1945 he persuaded the (Communist) authorities to do an experiment – 50% of a large set of schools would learn music as part of the curriculum and 50% would not. The results of this experiment showed that children in the music-based schools learned much quicker than those in the other schools. Today many Hungarian schools use Kodaly's methods, and these methods are taught around the world, including here in Britain.

The message here is that learning music is good for children and their education. A tiny fraction of the Woodley competitors will have any serious

aspiration towards being a professional musician, but they will all have learned many skills and aptitudes that give benefit well beyond the music that they play.

Pop musicians show us all that music can take many forms, and also that creating music and performing it is not something reserved for the rich – it is lurking inside a large percentage of each of us. Going to Woodley each year brings home to us that, with home encouragement and seizing opportunities, many of our children could be capable young musicians. Everybody has a voice, so you do not have to play an instrument to be in there (although it helps!).

Unfortunately, few schools build music into the work of the normal school day – although some do. I feel sure that in each class in our primary schools there are several children who have a hidden aptitude for music These children would, given the opportunity and encouragement, gain, not just in musical terms, but by general educational benefit in school work and exam results that come from the framework of self-discipline that being an active musician brings.

Learning an instrument may entail having private lessons – but in many cases Berkshire Maestros (who are already a presence in many schools) will be able to help, either within the school or by individual lessons or by hire of instruments. They also arrange ensembles and orchestras that allow young people to learn precision teamwork to achieve good performances.







