A message from Huw

Thirty Years On

In 1988 Britain looked rather different. Television saw the first ever Red Nose Day in February, while in November Doctor Who celebrated 25 years of broadcasting, as Sylvester McCoy faced the Silver Nemesis. Apartheid was still in power in South Africa, and a huge tribute concert to honour Nelson Mandela's 70th birthday was held in Wembley, watched by 600 million people worldwide. Thatcher was still Prime Minister although, with riots over the poll tax spreading, the writing was on the wall. After much heart searching, the Church of England took the decision that women could be ordained priests, while 16-year-olds were sitting GCSEs for the first time. And on July 3rd, I was ordained priest in Rochester Cathedral.

Getting ordained was not something I rushed into; it had taken me almost 11 years to reach that point. And yet that time, of preparation and self-examination, served me in good stead. Inevitably, the last 30 years have not always been easy; there were periods when everything seemed to be flourishing, and others when decay seemed to be everywhere. Through all of that I have learnt a lot more about myself, and also about God.

Of myself, experience has taught me (sometimes painfully) what my strengths and weaknesses actually are, as opposed to what I would like them to be. Circumstances have forced me to recognise the flaws in my character – those things I've tried to hide from but which are blazingly obvious to others – as well as discovering those things that are necessary for my wellbeing. What I've learnt about God is harder to put into words. There is nothing that I believed in 1988 that I don't believe now; week by week I continue to recite the Creed with honesty and conviction. Yet so many things are true in a deeper and richer way than I knew back then. It is easy to say, "For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven," but the staggering implications of God's commitment to me are now clearer to me – well, a little anyway. There have been times when I wondered what on earth God was playing at, times when it felt as though he might have abandoned me. In fact, when I've looked back, those have been the times when God has been most at work, protecting and guiding me. He has never left me.

Who knows what the next thirty years will hold? Maybe I won't have that long – I could be hit by a bus tomorrow. Maybe I'll go on to 130, and be a confounded nuisance to all my surviving friends and relatives (which sounds more fun than

the bus!). Either way, my confident hope is that God will still be with me, for better and worse, until the end. "For I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day." 2 Timothy 1.12.

Guide Dogs Charity

We were thrilled to be supporting Guide Dogs at this year's May Day Fair and to have a number of guide dogs present. It was such a busy afternoon that I totally forgot to put a call out for Ron Field, Group Coordinator for East Berkshire Fundraising Group to give the talk he had prepared. Huge apologies Ron! I therefore thought it would be a nice idea to include it in our parish magazine as it's full of interesting facts and figures!...

On behalf of Guide Dogs & the East Berkshire Fundraising Group thank you for inviting us to the Fair. What a fantastic afternoon. Hope you enjoyed the chance to meet our owners with their amazing dogs who live in the local community. I also hope you will be able to learn more about the services the Guide Dogs offer.

The 25th Anniversary of the Fair fits with a significant event for Guide Dogs back in 1993. Our HQ was then based down the road in Windsor at Alexandra House in Park Street, not far from the Castle. The Charity was growing, so the premises became too small, and we moved to our current location at Hillfields, Burfield Common, near Reading.

Some facts and figures for you in 1993:-

- The Windsor office had 100 staff with only 5 employed for fundraising. The overall GD staff was 850. Today we have 1500 staff, with 139 employed for fundraising.
- ❖ In 1993 GD had 4000 partnerships, and today that has risen to 5015.
- The breeding programme in 1993 produced 875 puppies, last year we had 1375 puppies, most of those at our specialist Breeding Centre in Leamington Spa, which opened in 2011.
- Locally, we have 46 people waiting for a Guide Dog.

Talking about puppies leads me into your aim today - to raise £1500 to be able to Name A Puppy. Hopefully, this pup will go on to be trained and become one of our amazing dogs, and 'change someone's life'. With your kind support and donations we can continue with our work to 'make a difference' for people who are visually impaired. Thank you all. To find out more visit:

News from around the Parish (cont.)

Ascot Horticultural Society

One of the great joys of life must surely be to step out into the garden or countryside early on a sparkling morning in late May or June. All around plant growth rate is at its maximum and there is frenzied activity as the myriad inhabitants of the natural world go about their business as if there was no time to lose. The air resounds to birdsong and the buzzing of insects. For a moment the long and particularly gloomy, cold and wet winter, which this year brought severe challenges and setbacks in many parts of Britain, especially for farmers and gardeners, seems like a distant memory.

The Chelsea Flower Show, arguably the World's most prestigious horticultural event, effectively 'kick starts' the summer season and, appropriately, it forms the subject of our meeting on Wednesday 13 June. When it comes to Chelsea there's none more experienced than Hillier Ltd, winner of a record 71 consecutive Gold Medals. Their stunning displays have been a highlight of the

show for as long as most of us can remember. Who better then than Kevin Hobbs, Head of Research & Development at Hillier, to be our guest speaker. In a talk entitled "Hillier - The Chelsea Flower Show Experience". He will be introducing us to the lengthy, laborious and costly process undertaken yearly by the company to create a real 'show-stopper'.
