A message from Huw

Love in Action

Once upon a time there was a beautiful princess, who wove the most wonderful shirts in the world – but each one she made took a year off her life. And she had to go on weaving them. In a fairy story, she would be rescued from her slavery before she died; or she would die but her shirts would be preserved as treasures, because of the great price she paid.

We do not live in a fairy tale world. We live in a world where many of our clothes come from sweat shops around the globe, where children labour until their health is ruined, or they die. And what they make at such great cost is not treasured, but bought cheaply and thrown away. Many of my T-shirts come from such a source, but I don't like to think of that. Money is tight for us all, we have bills to pay, and I'm glad when I get a bargain. Living in a glass house, I can't afford to throw stones at others.

We all like to think that we live in a fair world. It's comforting to think that if someone works hard they succeed and prosper, that poverty only comes to lazy people. If that were the case then those sweat shop workers would be millionaires and I would be a pauper. In reality we live in a world which is deeply unfair, where I live in comparative luxury, which others will never get the chance to reach. And it is an unfairness that we are called to fight against. Jesus told a story about Judgement Day, where the questions we will have to answer are: Did you feed the hungry? Welcome the stranger? Care for the sick? He finishes by stating: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me" (Matthew 25. 40)

At the start of June the combined PCC for all three churches met for the first time. It was a good meeting, with useful discussion, as well as matters for concern. (We need to raise an extra £15,000 next year to keep two of our churches in the black.) However, despite our financial situation a brave step was taken – we are going to give some money away to help those far worse off than ourselves. South Sudan is one of the poorest countries in the world. Civil war has rolled on for years, most recently since 2013, making it hard for people to thrive. The Fragile States Index looks to see how likely a country is to collapse – South Sudan currently has the highest rating. And it is a country that means a lot to me, as it where my parents met, and were married, back in the 1950s.

At that PCC meeting, each church pledged itself to send £20 a month to a church worker from Britain who is working out there. Lynn Treneary works with

the Church Mission Society, mainly in education, particularly for women, and that £60 will help her help many others. It isn't a great sum, but it could be argued that we shouldn't be giving anything away until we have our own finances sorted out. My hope is that this gift will be the first of many – one day our position will be secure and then I would like to see us being deeply generous, supporting many in need in this country and abroad. Until then, we have made a start, knowing that whenever we help anyone, no matter how seemingly unimportant, we are helping Jesus.

The Mercers and the Livery Companies of London

On Tuesday 29 May 2018, the Women's Guild made a happy visit to Mercers' Hall, the Hall (or residence) of the Mercers Company (known, formally, as the 'Worshipful Company of Mercers', to use the quaint but ancient term).

The Mercers by tradition are the No. 1 Livery Company in the City of London. Livery Companies (Guilds) are the descendants of the old trade Guilds, and many have names to fit, like the Fishmongers, Cooks and Carpenters. Most of these companies are ancient; many (including the Mercers) are more than 600 years old; but some are much more modern. The 'Information Technologists', for example, are 18 years old and No. 100 in the pecking order, and there are a total of 110 as of today; the latest, at 110, being the Guild of Art Scholars.

Some of the Livery Companies are still associated with their 'trade' – for example the Goldsmiths, the Vintners and all of the 'modern' Livery Companies. A common interest, though, for Livery Companies is to be 'fraternities' (often based on family membership, and including men and women) that are philanthropic, often in a way relating to the trade that provided their name. The companies are of varying wealth, and this defines to a degree the scope of their activity, but doing good works is a common interest. The Mercers Company is currently taking a lead in establishing a new shared cause to which all the Livery Companies can contribute in line with their resources. There are about 40,000 members of Livery Companies today, many of whom, young and old, are directly involved in their governance and good works, giving time, money or both. The Companies are working organisations, not dining-clubs, and, despite their antiquity, very much concerned with the issues of the 21st Century.

Another important aspect of the Livery Companies is their role in the governance of the City of London, particularly in the election of the Sheriffs and Lord Mayor of London. In modern times they have lost their role as an electorate for the main governing body for the City Corporation, the Court of Common Council: councillors are now elected by an electorate based on voting representation for City businesses of all kinds (not just the Livery Companies).

As Huw reported after the WG visit (p16): "the whole day was a fascinating look at a little known strand of London's history, and much appreciated by us all."







