A message from Huw

New Beginnings

A friend sent me a photo recently. It was of a baby on the phone, presumably speaking to another baby: "You'll never guess what happened! This freaky guy in a dress grabbed me and tried to drown me!! And nobody did anything to stop him!!!"

Perspective is everything, and I only just recognise a description of baptism in those words. Baptism is one of those things that I enjoy, and I haven't drowned a baby yet – in fact most of them seem to enjoy the whole experience. They are the star of the show and seem to relish being in the spotlight, especially the little girl who grabbed my glasses off my face which brought everything to a halt as I couldn't see what words came next. And for most of us, that would be our assumption about baptism; a happy family affair, with a baby at the centre, and lots of laughter and celebrations.

However it hasn't always been like that. In the early days of the church it would have been mainly adults who were baptised; it would have been joyful but solemn as persecution would often follow baptism. For roughly the first 300 years of its existence, Christianity was a minority religion; and identifying yourself with it could cost you friends, job or even your life. If the consequences were that steep why say it was joyful? Because baptism is the outward sign of God washing away our sins, forgiving us whatever we are most ashamed of, and giving us a fresh start. Here in the Benefice when parents want their children baptised we ask them to come to a preparation course. As part of this they are invited to come to the font, at the side of which we have placed some pieces of slate and bits of chalk. They can write any personal failing on the slate, dip it in the water – and the word has disappeared. God's forgiveness is as absolute as that, and that is something to rejoice in.

Baptism is something you can only do once, although there is no upper age limit to it. However, God's forgiveness is something I need over and over again, and is given freely every time I turn back to him. Our God is the God of the second chance – and the third and the fourth, as many as we need. This is the love that keeps me going, and makes it possible for me to stay a Christian. Baptism is the promise that God will give me a new beginning, whenever I need it. Like most of us I can't remember my own baptism, as I was only a few months old at the time it happened, but the truth it represented is the bedrock

of my spiritual life. When we make a mess of things it can be very hard to put them right, but God will give us a new start as often as we ask.

The Pipe Sponsorship Appeal for the Organ Renovation fund sold sponsorship for the last pipe in July 2018. So that Appeal is successfully finished. It set out to raise £7,503 in pipe sponsorship, but in the event it raised a magnificent £8,478 over the 16 months that the appeal ran.

This was made possible by the generosity of well over 60 donors, mostly but not all parishioners, who will be commemorated in a Roll of Honour in due course.

The main funding for the renovation was the sum of more than £32,000 donated over the last 7 years into the PCC account. In addition, the Mercers Company of the City of London gave a very generous grant of £10,000. So, with the pipe sponsorship, we raised more than £50,000.

Tarquin Wiggins, the organ builders, began the organ restoration on Monday 23 July and the work will take 3 months. It is planned that the organ will be available for Remembrance Sunday on November 11.

As the work progresses regular updates will be available and published on the website (FOSMW) and the notice board.
